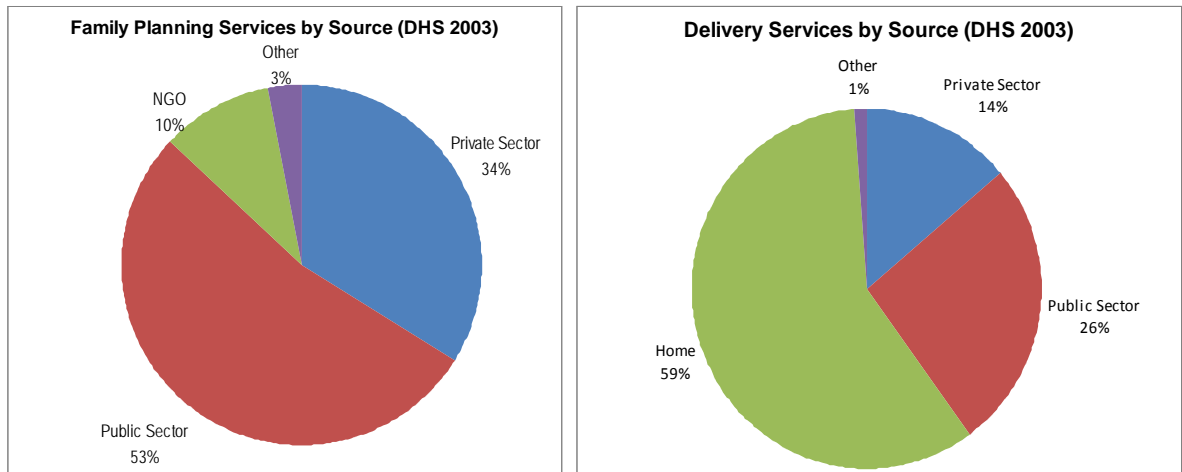
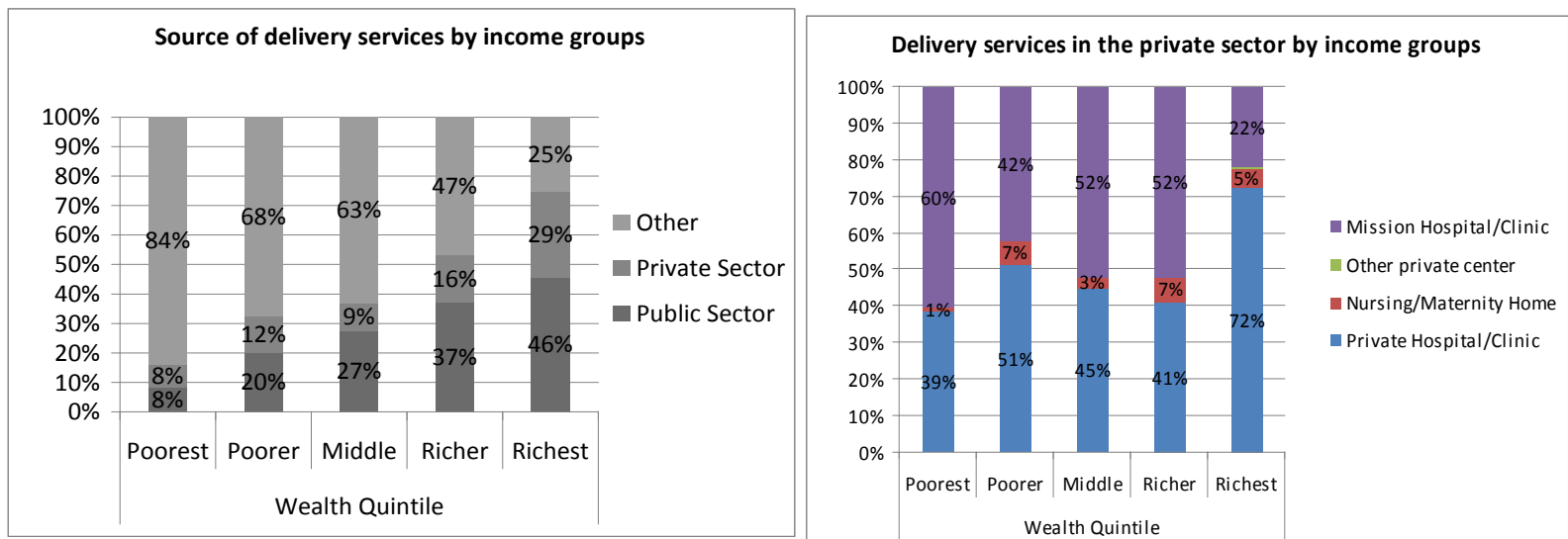


Examples: Presenting findings on service utilization

The Demographic Health Surveys (DHS) are the most common data source to help estimate demand. The DHS provides a wealth of data on where women seek health care in key health areas, such as family planning, child health, maternal health and HIV/AIDS. The charts based on the 2003 Kenya DHS illustrate how to display data that quantifies consumer demand for private sector services in specific health markets.



The DHS also allows the technical team members to dive a little deeper into consumer use of the private health sector. Using the DHS, the Kenya PSA analyzed use of private health sector services by income groups. The graphs below illustrate data on health care seeking behavior for delivery services by source and wealth quintile.

The table below illustrates the use of other data (in this case, a poverty assessment report) when DHS data is not available.

Use of Public and Private Facilities by Income Level
